
For the purposes of control and eradication of fruit flies pursuant to Section 7 clauses 2.2(2)(b), 2.2(2)(c), 2.2(3)(a) and 2.2(3)(b) of the Plant Quarantine Standard South Australia ("the Standard"), fruit and fruiting vegetables declared as a host for the pest fruit fly ("host fruits") must not be removed from a quarantine area without an approved treatment or processing and accompanied with the required proof. This Chief Inspectors Movement Certificate ("CIMC") provides approval under alternative conditions approved by the Chief Inspector pursuant to clause 2.2(2)(e)(iii) and clause 2.2(3)(c)(iii) as detailed below.

Approval is provided to any person(s) exiting a Fruit Fly Affected Area carrying host fruits under the following conditions:

- The host fruit must be commercially obtained through a retail storeⁱ; and 1.
- 2. The host fruit is accompanied by the itemised retail purchase docket providing proof of purchase of each of the host fruits being carried; and
- 3. At all times, including transport or storage pending consumption or processing of the host fruit, the host fruit must be kept within secure packagingiii; and
- Any waste from the host fruit must be disposed of by placing the fruit within two secure bags and then disposed of within a municipal general waste collection scheme, and must not be placed into green waste or composting.

Contravention of this certificate is an offence under the Plant Health Act 2009 s.8. Maximum Penalty: \$100,000. Providing false or misleading information is an offence under the Plant Health Act 2009 s.51. Maximum penalty: \$10,000.

ⁱ "**retail store**" means a retail outlet in a permanent, enclosed building and excludes roadside stalls, shed door sales, 'pick your own' or any other retail outlet where host fruit is stored, displayed or handled in an unenclosed area.
